

COVID-19 vaccines save lives

When you're vaccinated against COVID-19, you protect yourself, your family and your community from a deadly disease. Unvaccinated people are more likely to get COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.

COVID-19 vaccines protect against new variants like Delta and Omicron

which are easier to catch and much more dangerous to unvaccinated people than earlier forms of the virus. Vaccines are also critical to stopping the spread of COVID-19 before it can mutate into an even more dangerous form.

Safe. Effective. Free.

COVID-19 vaccines reduce serious illness and hospitalizations

From November 14, 2021 to November 20, 2021, unvaccinated people were 7.2 times more likely to get COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.

COVID-19 vaccinations are now available to young people aged 5 to 17 years old

So families can feel even safer as we venture out more, visit grandma and grandpa, go on vacations, and get back to doing the things we love.




·Matthew 22:37-40 – Jesus said the second greatest commandment is to "love your neighbor as yourself."

Fully Vaccinated



COVID-19 Mask Mandates for 2022

The COVID-19 vaccines remain effective in preventing serious disease, hospitalization, and death from the SARS COV-2 virus

Unvaccinated persons are more likely to get infected and spread the virus which is transmitted through the air and concentrates indoors. To ensure that we collectively protect the health and well-being of all Californians; keep schools open for in-person instruction; and allow California's economy to remain open and thrive, the California

Department of Public Health (CDPH) is requiring masks to be worn in all indoor public settings, irrespective of vaccine status, for the next four weeks (December 15, 2021 through February 15, 2022).

COVID-19 Mask Mandates for 2022

This new measure brings an added layer of mitigation as the Omicron variant, a Variant of Concern as labeled by the World Health Organization, is detected across California, the United States, and the world and is likely to spread more easily than the original SARS-CoV-2 virus and the Delta variant.

Additionally, this new measure brings additional protection to individuals, families and communities during the holidays when more travel occurs, and time is spent indoors.


