Pamela Harmell, Ph.D. is an outstanding and well-known lecturer who has spoken throughout the United States. Dr. Harmell is a lecturer at the Pepperdine University Graduate School of Education and Psychology teaching courses in the areas of professional ethics and the law, psychopathology and practicum since 1990.

Course Description:

This workshop addresses therapist responsibility to ensuring patient welfare in all aspects of practice. Participants will learn to deal with ethical dilemmas such as (1) suicide detection, assessment and prevention, (2) therapist self-disclosure and ethical issues, (3) therapist self-care, burnout and counter-transference, (4) working with minors, families and cultural competence, intersectionality, (5) working with dangerous clients: suicide and Tarasoff, (6) boundary issues, (7) multi-client situations: family, group, couple, and (8) supervision and ethical issues. Literature updates, along with relevant Codes of Ethics and current expert opinion will be included in all areas of discussion. This program reviews the current research findings and knowledge that inform ethical and legal practice.

- 1. Participants will be able to understand the difference between boundary crossings and boundary violations.
- 2. Participants will learn common causes of burnout and the DOVE model for therapist vulnerability and resilience
- 3. Participants will become aware of cultural competency when working with minors.
- 4. Participants will understand the court decisions related to multi-client confidentiality issues

- 5. Participants will increase their awareness around the connection between suicide, social media, and substance abuse.
- 6. Participants will be able to identify and avoid multiple relationship situations in psychotherapy.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Participants will evaluate the research and statistics prevalent to suicide and opioid use among youth and young adults.
- 2. Participants will identify three (3) non-suicidal self-injuries (NSSI) common among teens and young adults.
- 3. Participants will name the four (4) components on the D.O.V.E Model of Resilience and Vulnerability.
- 4. Participants will identify five (5) clinical implications of self-disclosure with clients.
- 5. Participants will assess intersectionality in working with diverse families while understanding cultural competency.
- 6. Participants will verbalize the difference between boundary violations and crossings.
- 7. Participants will identify three (3) ways to seek client records while ensuring legal and ethical mandates.
- 8. Participants will be able to describe two (2) types of subpoenas and the appropriate steps to handling court orders.
