Benjamin E. Caldwell, PsyD, LMFT. Dr. Caldwell is a California Licensed MFT and Adjunct Faculty for California State University Northridge. He is the author of *Basics of California Law for LMFTs, LPCCs, and LCSWs*, and editor of the *User's Guide to the 2015 AAMFT Code of Ethics*. He previously served a threeyear term on the AAMFT Ethics Committee, and spent 10 years as the Legislative and Advocacy Committee Chair for AAMFT-CA.

This training will update current supervisors and assist in preparing future supervisors of those associates and trainees pursuing licensure as a California LMFT, LPCC, or LCSW. Topics include legal and ethical requirements for supervisors and supervisees, remote supervision, addressing areas of difference and context, evaluating supervisees, common supervision tasks, and utilizing research findings to promote ongoing supervisee development. This course is designed to meet requirements for existing supervisors to receive at least 6 hours of Supervision CE in each two-year license renewal period.
