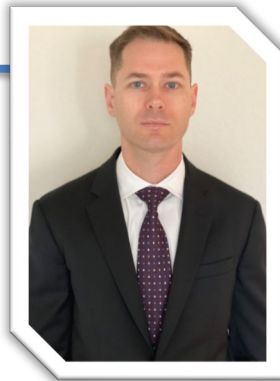

Course Description: This will be a six-hour power-point presentation (6 CEs) that will focus on new laws, caselaw and regulations that will impact public entity behavioral healthcare providers or their patients and clients.

Instructor Information: Linda Garrett has been providing risk management services to healthcare facilities and providers for over 25 years. As the loss prevention consultant for the CSAC Excess Insurance Authority Medical Malpractice Programs, she provides services to over 50 California public entity health, mental health, and correctional healthcare programs, as well as to several county hospitals in California. She also consults with a group of Nevada rural hospitals, providing similar education and loss prevention services. She trains providers and administrative staff on a variety of medical/legal topics including consent, charting, mandated reporting, involuntary mental health treatment, patients' rights, and federal and state medical confidentiality laws (including HIPAA/HITECH Act, and 42 CFR Part 2). Before working as a risk manager, Ms. Garrett practiced as a medical malpractice defense attorney for a law firm in San Francisco, California. She is a graduate of the University of California, Berkeley and UC Hastings College of the Law.

Andrew Garrett is an attorney who works directly with healthcare providers, helping them to navigate the laws of their profession. He concentrates on medical confidentiality, behavioral healthcare, correctional healthcare, minors' access to healthcare, and mandated reporting. He is perhaps most well-known for his extensive knowledge of 42 CFR Part 2, a federal regulation that gives heightened privacy protections to many substance use disorder records.

3. Improve understanding of roles, ethics and relationships with our patients and how social media has blurred our professional life and personal life

1. Articulate the requirement that all healthcare providers develop policies and protocols for handling restraining orders against parents that prevent them from accessing a minor's record
2. Describe a change in the law that may increase medical malpractice litigation
3. List several reasons that support ongoing efforts to improve documentation;
4. Describe the risks involved in discussing things "publicly" on social media and how seemingly unrelated discussions in that forum can impact the providers' relationships with their patients, their co-workers and their employers.
5. List two of the elements that form the basis of the Tarasoff "duty to warn" and at least two things that are not relevant to whether the duty is triggered or not.
6. Participants will be able to describe the HIPAA and Part 2 privacy protections and rights that attach to Part 2 substance use disorder records, including the right to receive a NPP, and to access the record.
